#### REPRESENTATION IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

There are 168 towns in the State—87 send two representatives, and 81 one each, making 255 members of the House; these towns are divided into 35 Senatorial Districts; and the eight Counties into 4 Congressional Districts, with *one* District at Large.

Hartford County has 7 Senators and 45 Representatives.

New Haven County has 10 Senators and 38 Representatives.

New London County has 3 Senators and 30 Representatives.

Fairfield County has 7 Senators and 33 Representatives.

Windham County has 2 Senators and 24 Representatives.

Litchfield County has 3 Senators and 41 Representatives.

Middlesex County has 2 Senators and 22 Representatives.

Tolland County has 1 Senator and 22 Representatives.
