The above vote of 1900 is for the highest candidate on each ticket. Of the leading parties the vote for individual electors was: Republican, Kellogg, 102,545; Bridgman, 102,567; Chapman, 102,567; De Peyster, 102,563; Williams, 102,572; Marsh, 102,537. Democratic, Bennett, 74,010; McNeill, 73,997; Coogan, 73,993; Burr, 74,014; Wheaton, 74,010; Stevens, 74,012.
