REPRESENTATION IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

There are 168 towns in the State—87 send two representatives, and 81 one each, making 255 members of the House; these towns are divided into 24 Senatorial Districts; and the eight Counties into 4 Congressional Districts.

- Hartford County has 4 Senators and 45 Representatives.
- New Haven County has 4 Senators and 38 Representatives.
- New London County has 3 Senators and 30 Representatives.
- Fairfield County has 4 Senators and 33 Representatives.
- Windham County has 2 Senators and 24 Representatives.
- Litchfield County has 3 Senators and 41 Representatives.
- Middlesex County has 2 Senators and 22 Representatives.
- Tolland County has 2 Senators and 22 Representatives.
