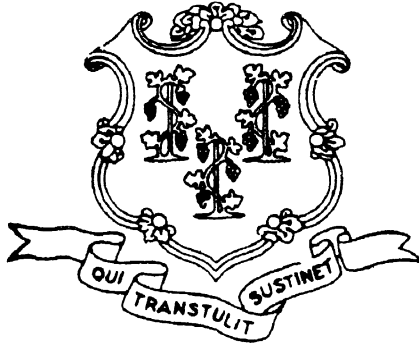


Notes:
